### What exactly is SEA?

Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is a *process* which evaluates the likely significant environmental consequences of a plan or programme (P/P) made by a public authority (e.g. Local Authority, Govt Department or Agency).





SEA can help us decide <u>what we can</u> and <u>where we can do it</u> without significantly harming the environment.



### How SEA can protect the environment



Tiering from strategic through to project level

E.g. SEA of National Plans SEA of Regional Plans **SEA of County Plans SEA of Local Plans** EIA of projects



"The objective of this Directive is to provide for a high level of protection of the environment and to contribute to the integration of environmental considerations into the preparation and adoption of plans and programmes with a view to promoting sustainable development....." (Article 1).

### **Scope of application of SEA Directive**

SEA Directive implemented via S.I. 435 and S.I. 436 of 2004.

# S.I. 435 of 2004 (all plans and programmes), as amended by S.I. 200 of 2011 S.I. 436 of 2004 (specific land-use plans only), as amended by S.I. 201 of 2011











### SEA Guidelines (2004)

Published to coincide with the implementing legislation (S.I. 435 & 436)

Published under Section 28 of 'Planning Acts'. SEA fully embedded in development plan preparation.

Applied across wide range of sectors (energy, transport, waste, agriculture....)

Supported by wide range of evidence-supported guidance from EPA and European Commission.
